

SURVEY - Perinatal Pelvic Health Service -help shape the service and education/awareness information

To support the Perinatal Pelvic Health Service in Derby & Derbyshire, women & birthing people are being asked to complete a survey to help shape the service and education/awareness information for women & birthing people.

The JUCD engagement platform is also live for women to access the service user survey and information around pelvic health - Perinatal Pelvic Health Service (PPHS)

Blurb (patient):

"Anyone can be affected by pelvic health problems during, or after pregnancy.

This includes accidental bladder or bowel leakage (known as incontinence), painful sexual intercourse and pelvic organ prolapse.

The perinatal pelvic health service (PPHS) offers support to those women/birthing people in pregnancy and 12 months after birth experiencing pelvic health problems, including early access to physiotherapy if required.

The Perinatal Pelvic Health Service is a joint service being set up between Chesterfield Royal Hospital and University Hospitals Derby and Burton.

The survey will help the project team in planning the service and education and awareness information for women across Derbyshire."
