Owen's Journey to an Apprenticeship at United Cast Bar



#### Spring 2025 Employer Visit – United Cast Bar

When Owen reached out to the Youth Hub in February 2025, he was eager to make a change and take a positive step toward employment. Encouraged by a friend who had previously accessed support, Owen contacted **Miranda** a decision that would set him on a clear path to success.



#### **Building the Foundations**

At his first appointment, Owen showed strong determination and a real willingness to learn. With Miranda's support, he created a professional CV and learned how to navigate job platforms such as **Indeed**, **Direct Jobs**, and **Find a Job**. Weekly sessions helped him gain confidence in writing cover letters and proactively reaching out to employers.



## Making the Most of Every Opportunity

Owen took full advantage of Youth Hub activities, including attending the **Chesterfield Hope Hack** a youth-led event that gave him the chance to explore real-life challenges and build communication skills. This experience played a big role in boosting his confidence.



#### A Turning Point: United Cast Bar Visit

In March, Owen joined a **Youth Hub employer visit** to **United Cast Bar**, in collaboration with *Careers Made in Chesterfield*. He toured the foundry, learned about advanced production processes, and met staff members gaining a firsthand look at the working environment.

Impressed by the experience, Owen took initiative and contacted the manager directly to express his interest in joining the team.



Thanks to his drive and preparation, Owen has now secured an **apprenticeship with United Cast Bar**, with **Chesterfield College** as his training provider.
