Commercial Substance Use Awareness Training: A Step Toward a Safer Workplace

An update from one of our trainers, Teresa. I've had the pleasure of developing and delivering Substance Use Awareness sessions focusing on the impact on the workplace. This training was delivered to a large firm, which brought together employees from across the company. The aim was to provide essential knowledge to help keep the workplace safe and to increase awareness of the potential risks associated with substance use. The feedback has been overwhelmingly positive. Many found the sessions engaging, informative, and relevant to their day-to-day roles. The interactive elements, especially the alcohol unit game, were a big hit, making it easier for participants to retain the information and apply it practically.

We are thrilled to be involved in the **Lived Experience Career Pathway** for individuals affected by substance use. It's a collaborative project from Derbyshire County Council, Derbyshire Adult Community Education Service (DACES), Derbyshire treatment and recovery partners and DAAS. The initiative aims to encourage, educate and support those with lived experience of addiction to volunteer or work in the recovery field, enabling individuals to use their unique experience to help others.

Lived Experience Career Pathway

As part of the pathway, DAAS will be delivering the **Enhanced Skills Practice Course** which aims to empower learners to put their knowledge into practice, learn valuable information and techniques crucial to supporting individuals affected by addiction. The course has been developed with skills-practice in mind, providing learners with a supportive environment to put their lived experience and skills in to practice. The course also covers enhanced alcohol and substance awareness, brief intervention techniques, change resistance, professional boundaries, stigmas and trauma-informed practice. The Enhanced Skills Practice Course is delivered by our Training Team Leader, Olivia who has lived experience of addiction.
