Introducing our new trustees -Dr Sonalee Joshi & Dr Ipsita Roy

Dr. Sonalee Joshi

" My Journey with the Asian Association started over 3 years ago, when I saw photos of the Diwali celebration on social media. I couldn't believe that in my town there was an Indian community, and I knew nothing about it, and furthermore I wasn't involved! I picked up the phone and spoke to Sushri Aunty and the rest is history!

I'm a GP at Inspire Health, working across our Hasland and Saltergate sites. I've been practising since 2012 after completing my training here in Chesterfield, a town I've grown to love. I see a wide range of patients and truly enjoy what I do. My husband, Silas, is a businessman— we met during Covid and are celebrating five years of marriage this year. He shares my love for the Asian Association and joins when he can. I visit India once or twice a year to stay connected to my roots— the food, the culture, and most importantly, family.

The Asian Association feels like my home away from home. The warmth and community spirit at the Centre always lifts me— I usually pop in on Wednesdays for a catch-up. Whether it's cricket, cooking classes, or community events, there's always something happening. I've come to know the staff and board well, and we truly feel like a family. As a new board member, I feel welcomed and heard. I try to be involved as much as possible because this place means a lot to me. I'm hopeful for a new, bigger premises soon so we can grow and support even more people in our community". We are delighted to recently welcome Dr. Sonalee Joshi & Dr. Ipsita Roy to our Board of Trustees and to take this opportunity to introduce them to you.

#### Dr. Ipsita Roy

Professor Ipsita Roy is a Professor in Biomaterials at the University of Sheffield's School of Chemical, Materials and Biological Engineering. Previously, she was a Professor at the University of Westminster, London. She has published over 100 scientific papers and secured research funding exceeding £13 million.

Originally from Delhi, India, she earned a B.Sc. (Hons) in Chemistry from St. Stephen's College, University of Delhi, and an MSc in Biotechnology from Jawaharlal Nehru University—graduating first in both. She received the prestigious Inlaks Scholarship to pursue a PhD in Biochemistry at the University of Cambridge and completed postdoctoral research at the University of Minnesota, USA.

Beyond academia, Professor Roy is a trained Odissi dancer and Rabindra Sangeet vocalist. She founded Robimoy, an organisation dedicated to the works of Rabindranath Tagore.

She recently joined the Asian Association of Chesterfield as a trustee and is committed to supporting community wellbeing, cultural engagement, and social impact.



Diwali Mega Show Celebrates Indian Temple Dancers and was funded by Arts Council England

On 7th October, we hosted the Diwali Mega Show at Chesterfield Winding Wheel, welcoming over 200 guests to celebrate the rich heritage of Indian temple dancers. The evening featured Kathak performances by Kumar Sharma and the Kathak Rockers from India, alongside Odissi, Bharatnatyam, and Mohiniyattam performances by the Aradhana Dance Foundation, Dr Sumana and her daughters from Nottingham, and Swetha from Cambridge.

A special guest performance by the Hoverla Ukrainian Dance Foundation added to the vibrant atmosphere.

As part of our Diwali celebrations, we partnered with Holme Hall Primary, Youlgreave All Saints C of E Primary, Chesterfield College, Highfield Hall, Walton Holymoorside Primary, and Beeston Rise Care Home to deliver Indian dance workshops and performances. International artists Kumar Sharma and the Kathak Rockers, along with Aradhana Dance Foundation, performed for hundreds of pupils and staff, who also took part in Bollywood dance sessions.

At Beeston Rise Care Home, the event included a special performance to mark a resident's 90th birthday. Holme Hall Primary pupils also visited our centre for a Diwali craft session, where they made tealight holders and mandalas, and sampled Indian chai and a light lunch. We welcome interest from schools and community groups keen to host similar cultural activities.


